

EAP: Know the Emergency Action Plan

Turf officials play a crucial role in maintaining safety and order during games on the field. Being prepared to respond effectively to emergencies is essential for ensuring the well-being of players. Here's how turf officials can implement an emergency action plan:

Preparation:

1. Understand Roles and Responsibilities:
